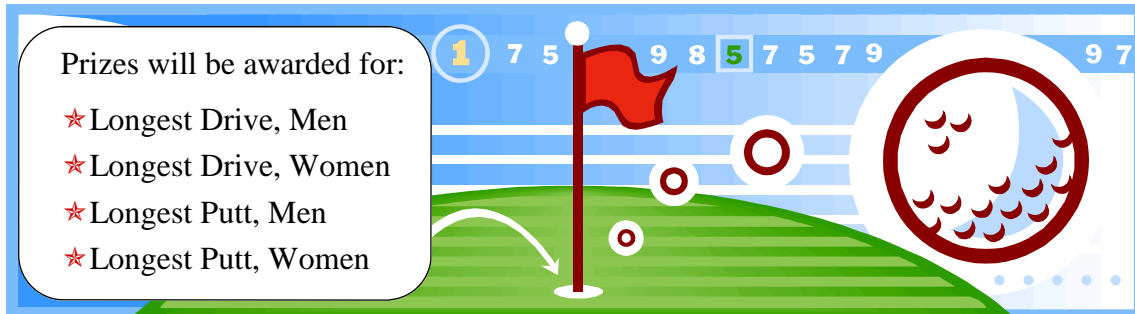

Housing Services for Eaton County Annual Case Management Statistics

In 2008, HSEC provided case management for 637 adults with 585 children.

461 Households ~ Included in these figures were 228 homeless, 178 evictions, 36 relocations, and 19 foreclosures.

In 2007, HSEC provided case management for 627 adults with 670 children.

491 Households ~ Included in these figures were 231 homeless, 215 evictions, 11 relocations, and 34 foreclosures.

In 2006, HSEC provided case management for 697 adults with 676 children.

502 Households~ Included in these figures were 220 homeless, 223 evictions, 22 relocations and 37 foreclosures.

In 2005, HSEC provided case management for 517 adults with 511 children.

385 Households ~ Included in this number were 135 homeless, 173 evictions, 56 relocations, and 21 foreclosures. The decrease from last year was due to lack of funding.

The evidence points to an increase in households struggling, even during periods of economic boom.

HSEC provides case management for many households each year. Beginning with 2006, funding shortages have forced HSEC to limit how many people could be helped. As a result, many families with children were reluctantly turned away.

Homelessness does not discriminate. Individuals and families who are in danger of or have become homeless vary in age, race, religion, gender, educational, and financial background. Their situations are as unique as they are. Common problems can turn into disasters when limited resources are available.

Prevention is the key

Upon qualification and with the aid of the client, HSEC will fund either; one month's rent or one mortgage payment. Funding is based upon the availability of grants and donations in the Eaton County area. Knowledgeable, experienced, and dedicated staff assists clients as quickly as possible and get them in touch with the resources they need to stabilize their situations.
